Dear Student,

How time flies! I would like to begin scheduling sophomores for junior year. Please complete and return the attached scheduling form with your parents and then log into PowerSchool between November 28, 2023 to January 5, 2024.

Helpful guidelines - *Before logging into PowerSchool to complete your course selection process:*

Consult your teacher and parents for advice. Look at your current level to determine next year's academic level. If you are at 83 or higher, you may consider going to the next level. If you took your PSAT's, review your AP Potential from your PSAT's on CollegeBoard.org. If you are interested in reviewing courses that can also earn you college credit please click on the link for [College Now at Eastern Handbook](#) or go to <https://www.eccrsd.us/Page/1218> to access the handbook.

1. Everyone needs and English class; select the appropriate level.
2. Everyone needs Health and PE or Lifestyle Fitness.
3. Most students will take US II and complete their high school requirement of history (World, US I, and US II).
4. Consult with your science and math teachers for planning and levels of your science class.
5. Math teachers have already discussed your options for next year. Again, use your numerical average plus the teacher's suggestion for your math program.
6. World Language - one year is required for high school. Colleges may require 2, 3, or 4 years of the same language. Check that college's website if you are thinking about specific schools.
7. Elective - think about choices that you would be interested in exploring, talk to friends and read your course guide. Colleges like to see academic electives, so do not load up on the non-academic electives. When choosing an elective, remember you must successfully complete graduation requirements in the following areas:
 - Visual/Performing Arts (5 credits)
 - 21st Century Life and Career or Career Technical (5 credits)
 - Financial Economic Literacy (2.5 credits)
8. Provide 15 credits or more of alternate choices. I will insist at scheduling that you have this thought out ahead of time.
9. If you do not meet district prerequisites for a particular course, a completed course waiver form will be required. The waiver period is from November 28, 2023 to April 30, 2024. You may obtain a waiver form from me.
10. You will receive a pass from me to review course selections when you have completed the following:
 - Completed the course selection process in PowerSchool.
 - Returned your course selection worksheet with parents' signature to me.
11. Upon completion of your work in PowerSchool and receipt of your course selection worksheet, I will review with you your requests to ensure that you have selected the appropriate courses or your junior year.
